

## The Maurice Biglin Wild Flower Trophy Competition

The definition of a Wild Flower is a flowering plant that is native to its location. It is a species, not a cultivar, it has not been introduced to that location by man and it is not an escapee from a garden, park or other cultivated area. The term flower automatically excludes Fungi.

However as most of us are not botanists, for this competition we will accept any plant that appears to fit the above description and has not been planted, grown or cultivated by man.

The final decision as to how well a plant fits into the category will be at the discretion of a specialist judge.

You may enter up to three (3) prints and they should have one of our competition labels on the back with your membership number, the competition name and the name of the plant. This is an applied competition, so the print title should be specific and as accurate as possible, ideally with the scientific name of the plant, though we will accept a common name.
